- **Principles** - fundamental assumptions that underpin all the goals, strategies, and outcomes of the plan.
- **Goals** - broad, long-term aim that defines fulfillment of the vision.
- **Strategies** - a policy, infrastructure improvement, partnership, or other activity required to create a critical condition or overcome a barrier to achieve an outcome.
- **Outcomes** - specific, quantifiable, realistic targets that measure the accomplishment of the goals and strategies.

1. We envision a vibrant, inclusive, people-centered and well-connected neighborhood that blends affordable homes, accessible transportation, and energy-efficient design with opportunities for learning, work, and play. The neighborhood will foster self-sufficiency, wellness, and family-friendly investment, creating a place that serves all aspects of life and reflects the shared goals of all residents.
2. Our vision is to build a people-centered community where everyone can access affordable, diverse, and sustainable homes, strong services, and opportunities to thrive. Together, we will create and reap the benefits of a safe, connected, and welcoming neighborhood that supports families, values youth, and celebrates the strength and diversity of all who call it home.
3. We live in a vibrant, welcoming neighborhood that celebrates our diversity, creativity, and connection. Here, we have a variety of high-quality housing choices, spaces to gather, and trusting relationships with neighbors that encourage us all to pursue our dreams. We live in a safe, integrated neighborhood where access to opportunity, education, and wellness is available within the community.
4. We are a people-centered, resident-first community where everyone has a voice and access to affordable, sustainable homes, quality services, and opportunities to thrive. Our neighborhood is safe, clean, and connected, with diverse housing, accessible transportation, and inviting spaces to gather that support wellness, learning, and belonging for all ages. Together, we care for one another, celebrate our diversity, and invest in our shared future, creating a vibrant, inclusive, and forward-looking community we are proud to call home.
5. Vibrant, inclusive, people-focused, and well-connected, Parkway Place is known for its diverse range of affordable, energy-efficient housing, supportive services, and opportunities for learning, working, and recreation. The revitalized community promotes self-sufficiency, wellness, social connection, and family-friendly investments, creating a safe and welcoming neighborhood that meets the needs of all residents.

GOALS are a broad, long-term aim that defines fulfillment of the vision. For the Parkway Place Planning Initiative, each goal will later be organized into one of the three tenets: Neighborhood, People, and Housing. Currently, goals are organized by one of five Working Group Topics.

Draft **Workforce Development** Goals:

- Create opportunities for achieving gainful employment in the neighborhood.
- Improve accessibility within, into, and through the neighborhood for all modes of transportation.
- Increase access to entrepreneurial opportunities and education.
- Connect residents with career development pathways and resources.
- Ensure community-led plan implementation.

Draft **Safety & Security** Goals:

- Uphold community and lease standards in Parkway Place.
- Incorporate trauma-informed violence prevention programming into the community.
- Create positive relationships between the community and adolescents and their parents.
- Develop meaningful partnerships with youth-focused entities.
- Increase communication between LMHA and residents.

Draft **Housing** Goals:

- Build new mixed-income, mixed-density housing on site.
- Minimize displacement during the redevelopment of Parkway Place.
- Connect neighborhood residents with homeowner and tenant resources.
- Construct accessible and resilient housing.
- Uphold high standards of management and stewardship of Parkway Place.

Draft **Youth** Goals:

- Kids come to school ready to learn.
- Expand options for high-quality, accessible childcare for working parents.
- Connect parents with resources and tools to foster stronger relationships with children.
- Provide programming space for youth in the neighborhood.
- Expand access to out-of-school time programming that supports in-school learning.

Draft **Recreation, Beautification, & Outdoors** Goals:

- Create vibrant, welcoming public spaces for neighborhood residents and visitors.
- Promote access to high-quality green spaces.
- Reimagine the Parkhill Community Center as a recreation and resource one-stop-shop for all ages.
- Create a safe and welcoming street environment that welcomes activity.
- Document the stories of Parkway Place residents and history.
